

INTRODUCTION TO CONTRACT LAW IN ZAMBIA

(Prepared in accordance with Zambian statutes and legal standards)

1. WHAT IS A CONTRACT?

A contract is a legally enforceable agreement between two or more parties that creates mutual obligations. In Zambia, contract law is primarily governed by the **Contracts Act**, **Cap. 149** and relevant common law principles.

2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF A VALID CONTRACT

To be enforceable under Zambian law, a contract must include the following elements:

- Offer and Acceptance: One party must make a clear offer, and the other must unambiguously accept it.
- Consideration: Something of value must be exchanged between the parties.
- Intention to Create Legal Relations: The parties must intend the agreement to be legally binding.
- Capacity: Parties must have legal capacity (age of majority, sound mind, not disqualified by law).
- Legality of Purpose: The contract's purpose must be lawful.

3. TYPES OF CONTRACTS

Contracts may be categorized as:

• Written Contracts (e.g., employment contracts, sale agreements)

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- Oral Contracts (enforceable if proven, but harder to establish)
- Implied Contracts (arising from conduct of parties)

Note: Some contracts must be in writing (e.g., land sale agreements under the Lands Act).

4. COMMON CONTRACT CLAUSES

- Governing Law Clause: Specifies Zambian law as applicable.
- **Dispute Resolution Clause:** Outlines procedures for arbitration or litigation.
- Confidentiality Clause: Protects sensitive information.
- Termination Clause: Sets out how and when a contract may be ended.

5. BREACH OF CONTRACT

A breach occurs when one party fails to perform their contractual obligation. Remedies under Zambian law include:

- **Damages:** Compensation for loss suffered.
- Specific Performance: Court orders the breaching party to fulfill their obligation.
- **Injunction:** Prevents a party from taking certain actions.
- **Rescission:** Cancels the contract and restores parties to their original positions.



6. CONTRACT ENFORCEMENT IN ZAMBIA

Contracts may be enforced through the **Subordinate Court**, **High Court**, or through **arbitration** depending on the monetary value and dispute resolution clause. The **Arbitration Act**, **Cap. 40** also supports alternative dispute resolution.

7. SPECIAL CONTRACTS UNDER ZAMBIAN LAW

- Employment Contracts: Governed by the Employment Code Act No. 3 of 2019.
- Company Contracts: Regulated under the Companies Act No. 10 of 2017.
- NGO Agreements: May fall under the NGO Act No. 16 of 2009.

8. PRACTICAL TIPS FOR CONTRACTING

- Always read the contract carefully before signing.
- Ensure all terms are clear and mutually agreed.
- Retain a copy of the signed document.
- Seek legal advice where necessary.
